Annual Gift Exchange during December meeting

The Gift Exchange Process:

Members are asked to plan on bringing one or more "gifts" to the December meeting. The gift should be something related to wood turning. It can be a tool, a book, a piece of wood, a finished wood turning, CD/DVD, or anything else that might have similar subject matter.

As people arrive for the meeting, they will be given a gift exchange ticket. Note that everyone attending the meeting is given a ticket, members and guests alike! When the exchange begins, with all the gifts on tables at the front of the room, the person holding the stubs begins drawing tickets. As each ticket is drawn the person holding the number comes to the front and claims any one of the gifts desired. The process is repeated until all stubs have been drawn. As the stubs are drawn, they are kept in a second container. Ticket holders also keep their tickets.

If additional gifts remain, the drawing process starts again with all the stubs that have been held and continues until all the gifts have been claimed. It's possible that additional rounds may be required if a large number of gifts have been brought by members.

So... dig through your shop (no need to purchase gifts unless you wish to) and find something cool to gift.

BEADS OF COURAGE

Beads of Courage: The size of the box, as a minimum, must be 6 inches wide x 5 inches deep. These boxes do not have to be round, they can also square. Jake Jacobson - Turning & Finishing Pens for Holiday Gifts

Jake, an expert pen turner, covered pen turning for holiday gifts. Jake suggested using pen kits like "Mesa" that only have one turned component. That way you can produce twice as many pens (gifts) in the same amount of time.



Jake also uses the spindle roughing gouge for almost all of the turning.



Remember, sanding is the first, and most important, step to a flawless finish that will last years and years.
